


Readings for June 18, 2023

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

A father was introducing his children to a friend. "This is Pete," he said. "He's the clumsy one." He went on, "This is Kathy. She's the sloppy one." He concluded his introductions with, "As always, Mike is last. I promise you, he'll be late for his own funeral."

We wouldn't think very much of a father who introduced his children by focusing on their faults and failings. Focusing on the faults and failings of others is a very easy thing to do. We do it all the time. We don't want people to focus on just our faults and failings though. We want them to focus on our positive qualities as well.


We wouldn't think very highly of a father who, like the father in that little story, focused only on the shortcomings and deficiencies of his children. Do we think the same thing of children who focus only on the shortcomings and deficiencies they see present in their parents? It's something to think about as we celebrate Father's Day this weekend.

When it comes to our fathers, it is very easy to focus on their shortcomings. We easily see the areas where our fathers are lacking, especially compared to other fathers. Maybe we see a lack of warmth and affection in our fathers. Maybe they are too strict and play the role of the disciplinarian more than we would like. Maybe they don't always have time for us or are a little slower to forgive than we prefer.

It's easy to see where our fathers may be lacking. Do we also see the good side of our fathers? Do we see the care they show us? Do we appreciate the wisdom they share or the values they help instill? They may not give us everything we want, but that does not mean they aren't generous. Do we see that quality in our fathers? Do we appreciate the lessons our fathers teach us, about how to do things and about what really matters? Most of all, do we see that our fathers love us and care for us even if there is little we may have done to be deserving of that love and care?

Fathers are not perfect. Neither are children. We certainly don't want our fathers to focus solely on our faults and failings. Let's make sure we return the favor to them, especially as we celebrate Father's Day. Let's make sure we see the good side of our fathers. Let's especially see that they love us and care for us even when we may have done little to deserve it. Happy Father's Day!

MHR LIBRARY NEWS

Have you ever struggled with technology? The next time you're having difficulty with your phone or computer, invoke Blessed Carlo Acutis for help. The Most Holy Redeemer library recently acquired *Carlo Acutis: A Millennial in Paradise* by Fr.Will Conquer.

In 1991, Andrea and Antonia Acutis had a son named Carlo. Although they were lapsed Catholics, Carlo displayed a remarkable curiosity about his Catholic faith. As Carlo grew, he developed a love for computers and video games. While he seemed like a typical boy, he fostered an intense devotion to the Eucharist. He began to document Eucharistic miracles on a personal website, which you can still access today (miracolieucaristici.org). Eucharistic miracles occur when the Eucharist visibly transforms into human blood or flesh, reminding us of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

Carlo succumbed to leukemia at the age of 15. In 2020, Pope Francis beatified Carlo, making him the first millennial to be declared "Blessed" by the Catholic Church. Check out this book to learn more about a teenager who loved video games and is now on his way to sainthood.
