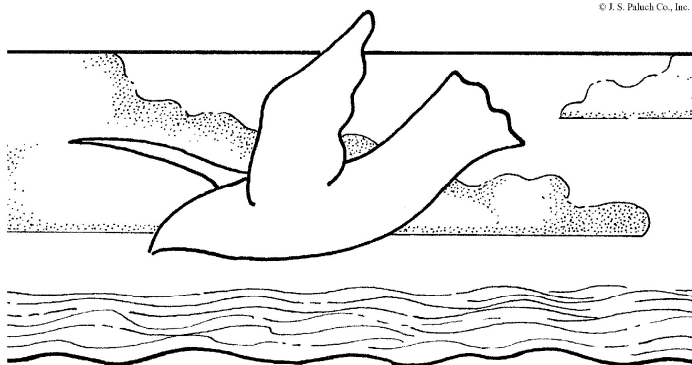

Pleasing God

As Catholics we believe that Jesus is both human and divine. This is an extraordinary statement to make and to believe. Of course, when I was very young, I didn't really think too much about it. Sister said that Jesus was human and divine, period. And if you asked a question, Sister told us, "It's a mystery." There, that's settled.

But, as an adult, I have put a lot of thought into what that might mean. I don't have any answers, though, only more questions. Did Jesus 'know' he was divine? did he know he was God's son? did he know he would be raised from the dead?

And although we will never have a definitive answer in this life, I have come to some conclusions for myself. Yes, I believe that Jesus was fully divine. Yes, I believe that Jesus was fully human. He had a free will. He had a choice. If he wasn't and didn't, then all that he did would not have been real. His baptism that we celebrate today would just have been window dressing, just a show. But I don't think that was so.

I believe he was raised as a very devout Jew who learned his scriptures, was taught by loving parents to always try and live a life pleasing to God, to strive to be holy. I'm sure he had to find his way to a relationship with God just like we do (he did pray alot, didn't he?) Perhaps in his desire to do that, and as part of his spiritual journey, he went out into the desert and heard John preach. John's reputation was known far and wide and Jesus surely would have heard about this prophet who was delivering a message of changing your life as a path to God. Wanting to learn all he could, Jesus went out to see for himself and had a conversion experience. That is what likely prompted him to ask for Baptism from John.

Something in John's words touched his heart as real and true and exactly what God wanted of him. So he did it. He could have walked away but he didn't. Instead, he chose to put his feet on a path that would lead him to a fuller and more complete relationship with God.

As we hear about Jesus' baptism, let us reflect on our own baptism and what that should mean to us. If Jesus' desire to be baptized was a way to develop his relationship with God, is ours doing the same for us? If Jesus' baptism was pleasing to God, was ours just as pleasing? And if God was well pleased with Jesus, does he continue to be well pleased with us?

ON THE CUSP OF A NEW CREATION

It was on the Fourth Sunday of Advent this past December that we first heard of the two cousins, John and Jesus, meeting. Then it was in the womb of their mothers, Elizabeth and Mary. Now the cousins meet again on the shore of the Jordan River. John is already well known—so much so that people had begun to wonder if he was the long-awaited Messiah. Jesus, on the other hand, is about to begin his ministry. One could say that Jesus entered the waters of the Jordan as a private person and came out of them as a public one. The voice from heaven left no doubt about that. As we come to the end of the Christmas season our readings echo Isaiah and Titus (see Advent and Christmas Day readings) and together with today's Psalm 104 they point us to Pentecost. We are on the cusp of a new creation.

John the Baptist was what we might call today a “social influencer.” People paid attention to what he had to say. And what he said affected the choices people made. Yet today's Gospel reminds us of John the Baptist's ultimate goal: “One mightier than I is coming.” The Baptizer walks the fine line between drawing attention to himself with his fiery preaching and then re-directing that attention to Jesus, the “beloved Son.” John the Baptist could be considered the “patron saint” of those who minister as lectors, extraordinary ministers of the eucharist, cantors, greeters, acolytes, and musicians. Isn't John's teaching a good goal for a liturgical (or any!) minister? Rooted in the graces of their own baptism, ministers must be skilled and confident enough to draw people's attention (or, at least, not turn them off!) and then gradually re-focus that attention on Jesus. It is a dynamic and awesome responsibility.

The Coordinator maintains a safe site providing high- quality programs based on the needs of students. He/she must work effectively with staff and volunteers. Energetic, self-directed persons with a love for children are urged to apply.

Program

The Coordinator will:

- Provide a high level of program quality including homework help.
- Monitor the atmosphere to ensure that both the students and tutors are treated with respect and the charism of the *School Sisters of Notre Dame* is upheld.
- Utilize positive strategies to promote the social and emotional development of the students.
- Work to establish positive relationships with parents and tutors.
- Maintain a safe, clean, and attractive space for learning.
- Act as a tutor as necessary.

Administrative

The Coordinator will:

- Pre-and post-test students to determine academic growth and maintain these records.
- Maintain accurate and up to date records for students and share these with the grant writer for the purpose of obtaining grants.
- Be the point person between Corazón and Catholic Charities for food service, keeping the necessary records.

Volunteer Tutors

The Coordinator will:

- Assist in the training of volunteer tutors and also participate in the planning of ways to exhibit appreciation for their service.
- Monitor tutor interactions with students to assure there is a good match between tutor and student.

Additional duties may be assigned by the Executive Director.

Requirements

- BA in Education and experience working with children.
- Complete Virtus training and background checks required by the Archdiocese of Chicago.
- Bilingual- Spanish- Preferred not required.

This is a 4 days a week position (Monday- Thursday) with 4 hours per day (2 pm- 6 pm), providing some time both before and after the program without students present.

Salary starts at \$22 an hr. negotiable depending upon experience.
