Today's Readings

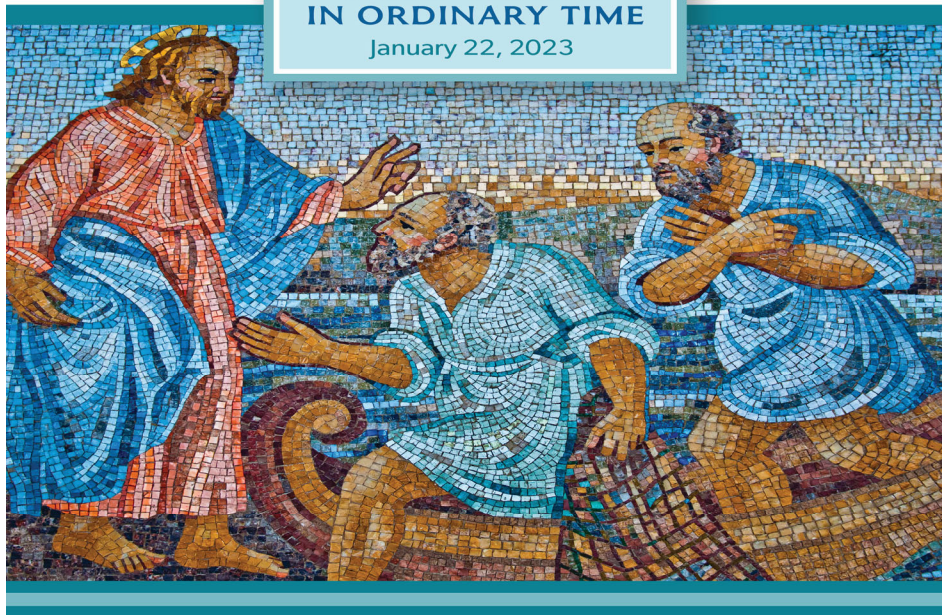
First Reading — The burdens that were once laid upon the people have been vanquished (Isaiah 8:23 — 9:3).

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

I hate telephone solicitations. Even though I am supposed to be on the “Do Not Call” registry, I still get these phone solicitations all the time – from alumni associations, from police officer and firefighter associations, and from a wide variety of charities. The caller will identify himself or herself and tell me the name of the charity or organization he or she represents. The caller will tell me they are conducting their annual fund drive and then ask, “Can I put you down for \$50?” That is what I hate about those calls. I don’t mind giving to different charities, but I don’t like to be put on the spot like that. I like to decide how much I’m going to give and when I’m going to give it and most importantly, if I’m going to give anything. It’s a lot easier to do that with solicitations by mail. I much prefer to have some time to think about if and to what degree I will respond rather than be put on the spot and have to make a decision right then and there.

In the gospel this weekend, we see Jesus call His first disciples. Peter and Andrew, James and John, all drop what they’re doing and go with Jesus when He calls them. They will follow Him for the rest of their lives. We tend to think of our own following Jesus as a lifetime commitment, and it is. Over the course of a lifetime, we will try to follow Jesus. There will be successes and failures along the way. In the end, we hope to have more successes than failures.

But while following Jesus takes place over the course of our lifetime, that lifetime is made up of individual moments, individual moments in which we are put on the spot. We see that in the gospel. Those first disciples had to answer that call to follow Jesus when it came. They couldn’t put it off. They had to answer the call at that moment.

In that sense, following Jesus is like an endless series of telephone solicitations. Following Jesus will constantly put us on the spot. I may have forgiven people in the past. I will forgive people in the future. But can I forgive the person who needs it right now, at this moment? We may have helped people in the past. We will help people in the future. But what about the person standing in front of us who needs our help right now? How do we respond when we’re put on the spot like that? We may have gone to Mass on Christmas. We’ll go again when one of our children has a part in the liturgy. But what about this week? What will we do when we’re put on the spot again on Sunday morning? Can we follow Jesus right now, at this moment?

Like a telephone solicitor, Jesus will often put us on the spot. We will have to make a choice right now to follow Him or not. We will have to make that choice over and over throughout our lives. When Jesus put those first disciples on the spot, they dropped what they were doing and went with Him. When Jesus puts us on the spot, as He will over and over throughout our lives, may we respond as those first disciples did. May we drop what we’re doing and go with Jesus.

January 22nd is the anniversary of the Supreme Court *Roe v. Wade* decision. Even though the Supreme Court overturned that decision this past summer, it has not put an end to abortion. The United States bishops have asked that January 22nd, or January 23rd when the 22nd is on a Sunday, be observed as a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. We will have a Holy Hour for Life following the 8:30 AM Mass on Monday, January 23rd. Please try to join us if you can.

Congratulations to Tom and Mary Riccio who were named MHR Persons of the Year at the Parish Appreciation Party last Saturday night. They have served our parish in many ways – as Eucharistic ministers, parish council members, Carnival workers, and choir members. They drive people to Mass and help at the adoration chapel. We congratulate Tom and Mary on receiving this honor. We are grateful for the service they, and so many others, give to our parish.

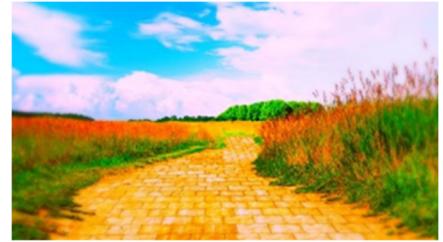

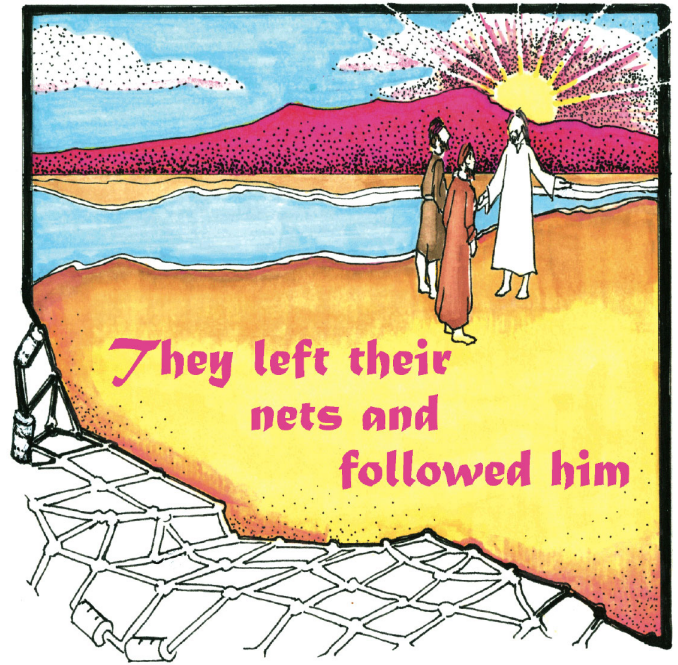
