A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

The annual Parish Financial Report for the 2019-2020 fiscal year is included in this week's bulletin. Normally, we publish this in October, but we have fallen a little behind this year. Also, we usually make the report available one weekend, and then I speak about the report at all the Masses the following weekend. Due to our limited attendance at this time, speaking at all the Masses would reach a very small audience. So, I am writing my comments about our parish finances this year instead.

First of all, I want to thank everyone who so generously supports our parish financially. Your support always means a lot, and even more in these days when the COVID-19 pandemic has had an impact on all we do. While our income has been affected adversely by the pandemic, we are doing better financially at this time than a lot of parishes. That is due to your continued generosity reflected by those who bring their weekly offering to church each Sunday, those who mail their donations in, those who drop them through the mail slot at the rectory, and those who give electronically. We are very grateful for all you do.

The pandemic certainly affected our income last year. We probably would have experienced a drop in our Sunday offering anyway because we had fewer people attending Mass. But that drop was accelerated by not being able to celebrate Mass with a congregation for several months. We had to cancel the Carnival. That was another large portion of income that we were missing. Not being able to have Masses with a congregation and not being able to have weddings and funerals meant that we did not receive the Mass stipend and stole fee income we normally would have. When you add it all up, our church income was down over \$100,000 from the previous fiscal year.

Church expenses were up about \$18,000. Salaries, insurance costs, and Archdiocesan assessments are going to increase from year to year. Our income has to increase to keep up. Because of the drop in our income, we were left with a church operating deficit of \$59,466. Normally, we have a surplus on the church side which we can use towards offsetting the school's operating deficit. We were not able to do that last year.

The school operating income was up over \$44,000 from the previous year. Unfortunately, school expenses were up a little over \$83,000. The school had an operating deficit of \$211,973. We did have other income of \$61,565. When you add it all up, between the church and the school, we had an operating deficit of \$209,874. Normally, we would have to take money out of mutual fund to cover the deficit. Had we done that this past year, it would have pretty much wiped out our mutual fund. We would then have to look into possibly liquidating the school endowment fund. Fortunately, one benefit of the COVID-19 pandemic was the opportunity to apply for a PPP loan. We received a PPP loan of \$438,700. The loan was forgiven in November, so we don't have to repay any of it. This does not appear in the report because it took place in the current fiscal year and the report is for the prior year. The PPP loan covered our parish and school operating deficit, so we did not have to take money out of our savings. PPP loans are again available, and we will be applying for another one.

While receiving the PPP loan was certainly good for us, the bad news is that we aren't taking care of our financial obligations ourselves. We can't depend on getting another PPP loan this time. I doubt they will continue to be available. We have to do a better job of meeting our parish and school financial obligations ourselves.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR CONT.

When the Archdiocese looks at the future of a parish, they primarily look at two things. The first is how many people attend Mass each Sunday. The second is the parish finances. Of the two, Mass attendance is the most important. The two do go together. The more people you have at Sunday Mass, the better the weekly collection will be. Even before the pandemic hit, our collections were going down because fewer people were coming to Mass. We have to change that.

The primary work of a parish is to worship God. It is not to have a school, even though a school is a great blessing. It is not to provide religious education, or social functions to attend, or organizations to belong to, or even to care for the poor and less fortunate. The primary work of a parish is to worship God. Everything we do – our school and religious education program, our parish organizations and ministries, our social functions, and our outreach to the poor and less fortunate – flows from our worship of God. That has to become a priority for us. If the worship of God does not matter, then we don't need a parish. If we don't have a parish, then we don't have a school, or a religious education program, or parish organizations and clubs, or an athletics program, or social functions. I know you don't like to hear that. I don't like to say it. But it's the truth. Our primary work as a parish is to worship God. If we aren't going to make that our primary work, we leave the door open for the Archdiocese to ask if we need a parish here. We have seen some parishes close and others consolidate as part of the *Renew My Church* initiative. We have not started that process yet, but we will, most likely later this year. Our attendance numbers will be part of the discussion. We need to improve them. I know that with the pandemic, there isn't an obligation to attend Mass on Sunday right now. The pandemic will end at some point though. We need to make attending Mass every Sunday a priority when it does.

The second thing we have to do is make sure our parish finances keep pace with expenses. We have been very fortunate that even with fewer people attending Mass each week we have been able to keep up with our financial obligations. Those who support our parish do so very generously. We just need more people generously supporting our parish. I have said this before, but I think it's worth mentioning again. We have 1,700 registered families in the parish. Our bulletin lists a weekly collection budget figure of \$12,500. If we received \$10 per week from every family in the parish, we would have a weekly surplus of \$4,500. Over the course of a year, that would give us a surplus of over \$200,000 on the Sunday collection alone. In most years, this would be more than enough to offset any operating deficits. Obviously, not everyone is going to give, which means that those who do give will have to make up for those who don't. If God has blessed us and we can give more generously, I hope we will. But the closer we can come to that \$10 per week per family average, the better off we will be.

Again, I want to thank you for your generosity to our parish and your faithfulness in your support. It's Inauguration Day as I am writing this. I am reminded of John F. Kennedy's famous words in his inaugural address, "Ask not what your country can do for you, ask what you can do for your country." Maybe we can change those words a little. Let's ask ourselves what we can do for our parish of Most Holy Redeemer. Hopefully, attending Mass each Sunday and supporting our parish financially will be at the top of the list.

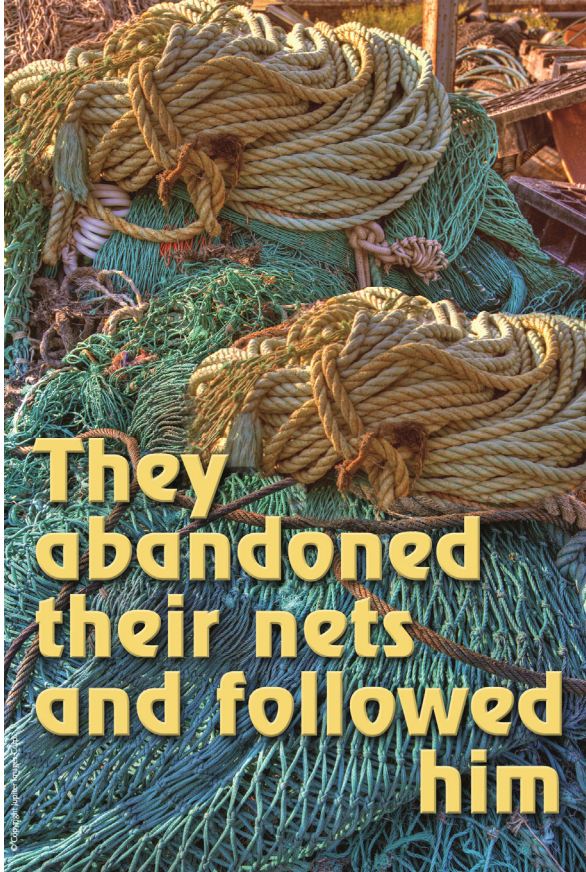

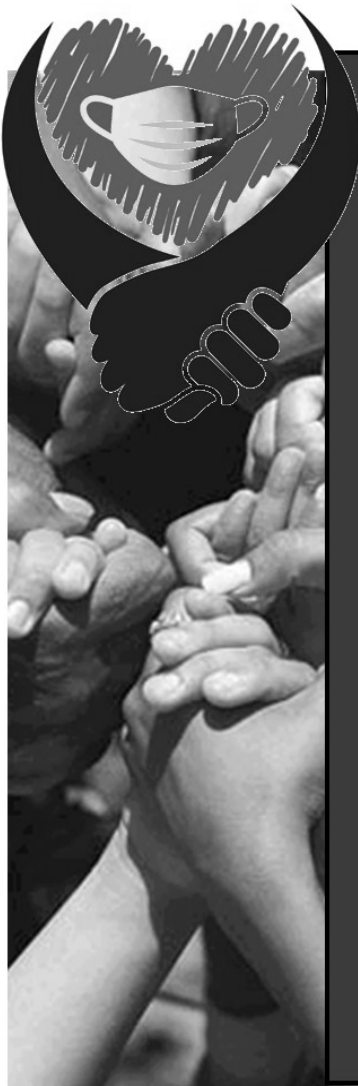

(3) The Parish Education Endowment Fund and Balanced Mutual Fund are at market value. Unrealized gains (losses) were (\$7,056) in 2020 and (\$10,262) in 2019 for the Education Fund and \$3,727 in 2020 and \$196 in 2019 for the Balanced Mutual Fund.

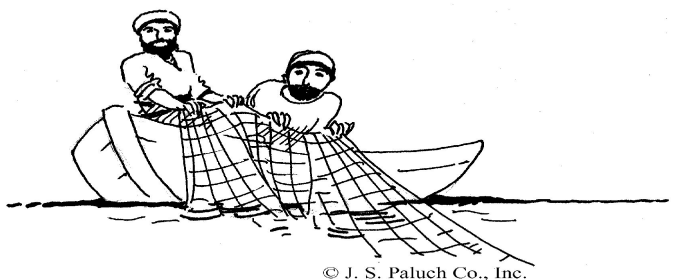

Despite the generosity of many, total church revenue suffered during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, due to the ongoing pandemic. Roughly 75% of our overall operating revenue comes from our Sunday Offertory. Your commitment to this vital collection funds parish ministries, our school and religious education programs, pays salaries, utilities and regular maintenance and repairs. In FY2019-2020, Sunday Offertory declined \$47,000 from the prior year. Due to the pandemic, we were unable to host the Parish Carnival, resulting in an approximate \$50,000 reduction to income. Other income includes stipends and stole fees and donations. Other Expenses includes altar and liturgical supplies, gifts/donations and meetings and speakers. The parish reported a net ordinary operating deficit of \$271,439. This includes \$211,973 in parish support to the school.

83% of school revenue is generated from tuition and fees. Total enrollment for the 2019-2020 school year was 338. Due in large part to the ongoing pandemic, school enrollment for the 2020-2021 school year is 297.

In an effort to keep tuition increases to a minimum, the School Advisory Board continues to try to raise funds through various fundraising events (primarily: Raider Raffle \$47,795, Great Lakes Gift Card Program \$16,767, Technology Night \$20,450 and Raider 5K Run \$15,340). Parish support to the school covered 10% of school expenses. Other Income of MHR School includes a \$15,000 donation from the MHR Athletics Association.
