## A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Lent is rapidly drawing to a close. The fifth week of Lent starts this weekend. Easter is only two weeks away. If we have been faithful to our Lenten disciplines and done the things we said we were going to do when Lent began, we're probably feeling pretty good about ourselves right now. But even if we haven't done all we had hoped to do on Ash Wednesday, we can still make this a successful Lent.

We can make this Lent successful by receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It's no secret that participation in this sacrament has really fallen off. Ask someone how long it's been since their last confession and you might embarrass them. Even though people don't receive this sacrament as often as they once did, there is still a great value in it.


One thing we should keep in mind is the purpose of this sacrament. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is not just meant to reconcile us with God. It is especially meant to reconcile us with the Church. Our sins hurt more than just those directly affected by them. Our sins let down the entire Body of Christ, the Church. We weaken the whole Church when we sin. The origin of this sacrament was not so much to reconcile people to God, but to readmit people to the Church who had committed serious sins, especially abandoning their faith in the face of persecution. A lot of people don't see a need for this sacrament because they think of sin as something that only affects God and the person they may have directly hurt. Many people feel they can ask God for forgiveness directly. There's no need to confess to a priest. But if we see our sins in a broader sense, as we should, then we have weakened the Church by our sins and we need to be reconciled with the members of the Church. The priest is not just a representative of God in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, but also a representative of the Church. He not only lets us know that God forgives us, but also that the other members of the Church, those we have hurt and weakened by our sins often without even realizing it, forgive us and welcome us back too.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation also gives us the chance to unburden ourselves of the guilt we may be carrying around over some of the things we have done. It gives us the opportunity to take stock of our lives. It's a chance to see that we're headed in a wrong direction and need to make some changes in our lives. If we never stop to take a look at our lives, we can easily begin to downplay our sinfulness, to start comparing ourselves to other people and think the things we're doing aren't really wrong. It is a concrete starting point to make some changes in our lives. If you think about when we most often resolve to change our lives, it happens twice a year – on New Year's Eve and on Ash Wednesday. That's because they give us concrete starting points to change. Every time we receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we have a concrete starting point to try to change our lives and again follow our Lord more closely. This sacrament is also valuable because we get to hear that we are forgiven. We can tell our sins to God privately in prayer and believe with all our hearts that God forgives us. But we are human beings, and, as human beings, we often need some physical reassurance. We get that in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Through the words of absolution which we can hear, we have concrete reassurance that our sins are forgiven.

If it's been a while since your last confession, you might want to think about receiving this sacrament before Easter. We will have additional times scheduled for this sacrament, from 2:30 – 4:00 PM on Saturday, March 27, from 7:00 – 8:00 PM on Tuesday, March 30, and from 10:00 – 11:00 AM on Saturday, April 3. I hope you will try to take advantage of the opportunity to be reconciled with God and with the other members of the Church that we are offered in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.



## The Stations






