


Today's Readings

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

May is one of the two months in which we honor Mary. We will honor Mary this Sunday as we crown her at the 11:00 AM Mass. We will honor her again on Tuesday afternoon as our school has its May Crowning. While we certainly honor Mary as the Mother of Jesus and our mother, too, and look on her as the perfect disciple who always said, “Yes,” to whatever God asked of her, I think there is something else for us to consider about Mary.

When we first meet Mary in the gospels, it is at the Annunciation. Gabriel comes to Mary and announces to her that she is “full of grace and the Lord is with her.” Mary is deeply troubled by the angel’s greeting. The first words she speaks in the gospels are, “How can this be?” While she goes along with what God asks, she is fearful and has a lot of questions.

Contrast this with the last time we hear Mary speak in the gospels. This takes place at the wedding feast of Cana. Jesus is a grown man now, just beginning His public ministry. Mary’s final words in the gospels are spoken to the waiters at the wedding feast. She tells them, “Do whatever He tells you.” Mary has no questions about what Jesus will do or why He spoke to her in the almost insulting way He did. By this point, she has complete faith and trust in Him. After a lifetime of watching her son, she knows He will do what is best and do it at the right time.

I think this shows a real growth in Mary’s faith. She starts out filled with fear and questions at the Annunciation. She ponders what takes place as Jesus’ life unfolds and may not have understood what people, such as Simeon in the temple, said about Him. She certainly must have wondered why Herod wanted to kill her son and why strange visitors from the East showed up with expensive gifts. She wondered why her son stayed behind in the temple when He was 12, causing a frantic search. She must have wondered what He could have meant when He said He had to be about His Father’s business.”

Mary remained faithful through all those doubts and questions and we see the result of that at Cana. Mary has come to know that in the face of the crisis that arises for the newly married couple, Jesus is the one to turn to. She has complete trust that He will act and will do what is best. She tells others to trust in Him too and do whatever He tells them.

Even more than being a model of saying, “Yes,” to God, Mary is a model of how we are to grow in our faith. Like Mary, we have our doubts and questions at times. We question what God is asking of us. We have our fears about what God wants us to do. But if we remain faithful despite our questions, doubts, and fears, we will find that our faith grows stronger. Like Mary, we will learn that Jesus is the one to turn to. Like Mary, we will come to know that Jesus will act and will do what is best. Like Mary, we will be able to tell others with certainty, “Do whatever He tells you.”

As we honor Mary in this month of May, this spiritual progression in her life is something to aspire to in our own lives. Like Mary, may our faith grow to the point that we are willing to do whatever He tells us. Like Mary, may our faith grow to the point where we can confidently tell others to do whatever He tells them too.







COVID-19 Vaccinations Available to Homebound Individuals

Pathlights, formerly known as PLOWS Council on Aging, is partnering with AgeOptions and the Cook County Department of Public Health (CCDPH) to provide in-home COVID-19 vaccinations for suburban Cook County residents who are unable to leave home due to age, disability, or medical impairment.*

To be eligible for this program you must live in the jurisdiction of CCDPH (all of Cook County except for Chicago, Skokie, Evanston, Oak Park and Stickney) and:

Be a senior (65+) OR
a person with a disability
who requires
in-home assistance.

OR
Have to use adaptive equipment (like a ventilator, crutches, a walker, a wheelchair, etc.) and/or accessible transportation to leave home.

AND
Leaving home is not an option for you because doing so requires considerable and taxing effort.

*NOTE: The quickest way to get a vaccine is to participate in a vaccination clinic outside of the home. There are options for drive-through clinics where no additional walking is required. To see other vaccination options visit <https://vaccine.cookcountylil.gov/> or call 833-308-1988.

If you or someone you know fits the criteria, you can sign-up by calling the Vaccine Sign-Up Hotline: 833-308-1988 M-F 7am-10pm and Sat 8a-10pm CT or <http://bit.ly/homevaccine>

After sign-up, you will receive a confirmation email or phone call from one of CCDPH's COVID-19 Vaccine Provider Partners to schedule your in-home vaccination when the vaccine is available to you. Please be patient as we respond to a large number of requests. As always, we are available should you have questions.
