With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we continue to build the Kingdom of God in our midst. Our vision is to foster the faith of all through prayer, service, education, and ministry.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

On July 1, the changes that will be taking place at many parishes as a result of the first phase of *Renew My Church* commence. While we are not going through the structural changes at Most Holy Redeemer that other parishes will be experiencing, we should keep in mind that changes will still have to take place.

The biggest mistake we can make is to think that because we did not have to unite with another parish or go through any other changes, we are fine the way we are and can just continue on as usual. We aren't and we can't. One reason we did not have to unite with another parish or parishes is because our Mass count and financial numbers were above the benchmarks the Archdiocese set. While we were above these benchmarks, we were not so far above them that we can breathe easy. We should also keep in mind that the numbers used were from 2019. That was before the pandemic.

The Mass attendance benchmark the Archdiocese set was 800 per Sunday. We were at 862 in 2019. While above the 800 number the Archdiocese set, this is a drop of almost 60% from the year 2000 when our October count was a little over 2,000 per Sunday. We did a post-pandemic Mass count this past October. Our average attendance was just over 500. We were asked to do another Mass count on the weekends of May 14-15 and 21-22. Our average attendance for these two weekends was 433. It would have been even lower had it not been for Fr. Adamich's 100th birthday. The May number represents a drop of almost 50% since 2019.

It doesn't take a genius to see we can't go on like this. We will be in big trouble one day if we do continue in this direction. If we want our parish to be strong and thrive for years to come, we have to change this. Sunday Mass must become a priority for us once again. If we want Most Holy Redeemer to be a strong parish, we can't stay in bed on Sunday morning. We can't let other activities supersede attending Mass every week and expect our parish to be just fine. We can't go to another church on Sunday where the Masses are shorter or where we think the homilies are better or the music is better or something else is better and expect Most Holy Redeemer to thrive. I know that the dispensation from attending Mass on Sunday that began when the pandemic started has not been lifted by the Cardinal. I hope we will seriously think about that if we are using it as our reason for not returning to Mass at this point. Our lives have gone back to normal in so many ways. I hope we will let our lives go back to normal when it comes to attending Mass on Sunday. I know we haven't gone back to our full Sunday schedule yet. I have had people tell me that when we resume Mass at their preferred time, they will return. I hope that they would rethink that too. I hope we will be back to our regular Sunday Mass schedule soon. But until then, I hope having a strong, thriving parish would be more important than having Mass at the time that is most convenient for us. I have many people tell me that the Mass count numbers don't matter. It's the money that really counts. My experience has taught me otherwise. If you have people in church, there are ways to try to get them to give. If they aren't in church, it's a lot harder to get people to contribute. On Sundays where we have a lot of people in church, the collection is usually significantly higher.

The 800 Mass attendance number represents the minimum for being considered a viable parish. An October Mass count number of 1,200 or more represents long-term sustainability. It is certainly within our capabilities as a parish to reach that number for long-term sustainability. While we can reach it, whether we will reach it is another matter. Reaching it will take a change within each of us. I think this change in us has to take place before we think about evangelization or working with other parishes or any of the other changes *Renew My Church* may bring our way. I hope we will be up to making this change so our parish can be strong and thrive far into the future.

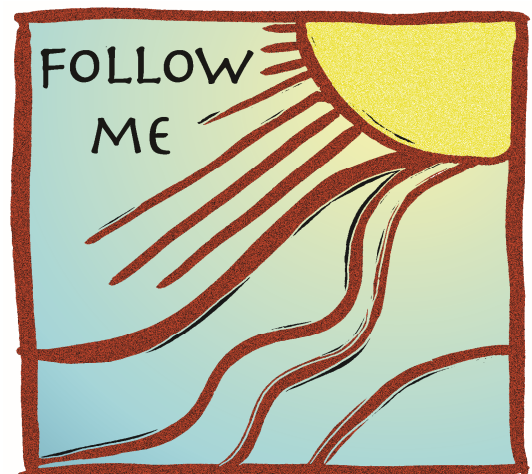

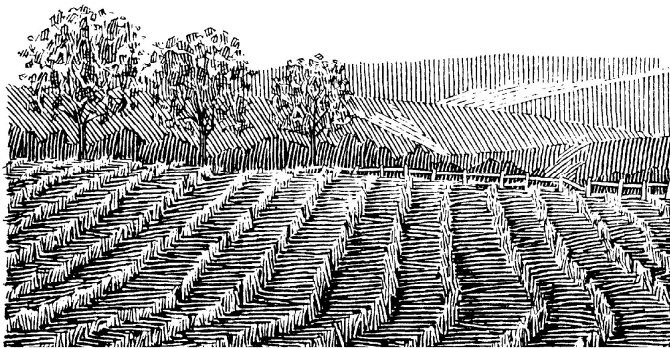
