

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

"In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that the whole world should be enrolled." These words are the beginning of the story of the Nativity from the gospel of St. Luke. It is the most familiar Christmas gospel and the one we come to Mass on Christmas expecting to hear. While this is the most familiar Christmas gospel, there are three other ones that can also be read. One of the more interesting of these other gospels is the one that is usually read at the first Mass on Christmas morning. It is also from the gospel of St. Luke and takes place after Mary wraps Jesus in swaddling clothes and lays Him in the manger. It is the story of what the shepherds do after the angels appear to them.

After the angels leave, the shepherds say to one another, "Let us go, then, to Bethlehem to see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." I think it's no accident that the word "this" is used here. The shepherds go to Bethlehem to see one specific thing. They go to see the baby in the manger. They go to see Jesus. They go to see God in human flesh. They go to see the Word of God made incarnate. They go to see the love of God revealed. That is the "this" the shepherds saw. Is this what we also see?

There are so many things that fight for our attention and occupy us at Christmas. We worry about whether people will like the gifts we gave them. We wonder whether we will get everything we asked for. We hope people saved the receipt in case we don't like what they gave us. Maybe we notice a string of lights that has gone out and we try to decide what to do about it. Dinner certainly grabs our attention. We want to make sure it's as perfect as possible. We may hope that our Christmas guests don't eat all of our favorite cookies. They can have all the fruitcake they want, but they better leave some of those good cookies for us. We see all of these things and more at Christmas. But do we also see this thing that the Lord has made known, this thing the shepherds saw?


Do we see this thing that Christmas is really all about? Do we see that this thing that has taken place reveals the love of God and the faithfulness of God? Do we see that in this thing that has taken place, that God has entered our world in human form? This thing tells us that God still enters our world in human form today, in the people we encounter in our lives. Do we see that in this thing that has taken place God reveals Himself to us? God shows us what He is really like. Do we see in this thing that has taken place that God never gives up on us? Do we see in this thing that God wishes to save us and have us live one day with Him forever? I hope we do. If we don't, we miss what this day is really all about.

Shepherds were pretty low on the social scale in ancient Israel. They were not considered particularly smart. These shepherds were smart enough though, to go to see this thing that had taken place that the Lord made known to them. This Christmas, I hope we will be just as smart as these shepherds. There are many things that will cry for our attention this Christmas. I hope we will make sure that one thing that gets some of our attention is this thing that has taken place. This thing is what Christmas is about. It is this thing, this thing which the Lord has made known to us, that brings meaning and joy to Christmas and to our lives. Merry Christmas!

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

"The Word was made flesh, and he made his dwelling among us." These momentous words from the beginning of John's Gospel describe exactly what we celebrate at Christmas. Jesus, the eternal Son of God, has indeed come among us and become a part of our human family. He shared our joys and our sorrows. He came to know the full expanse of our human experiences, those that lift us up and those that cast us down. Through his death and resurrection, he has transformed our lives and our very world. God bless you and all your loved ones. As I celebrate the Eucharist in this Christmas season, know that I bring all of you to the altar with me.


