

### A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

It seems like it was just Ash Wednesday and already it's Holy Week. Holy Week begins this weekend as we celebrate Passion Sunday, or Palm Sunday as it may more familiarly be known. We read today of our Lord's triumphant entry into Jerusalem at the beginning of Mass as we bless our palm branches. Later, we will hear of our Lord's betrayal, and His suffering and death on the cross. Maybe Jesus would have liked to just jump from His triumphal entry into Jerusalem straight to the glory of the resurrection and skip the suffering and death in between. Jesus knew though, that the only way to the glory of the resurrection was through the cross.

Sometimes, I think we like to jump straight from Passion Sunday to Easter Sunday. We're here on Passion Sunday, but we skip the other events of Holy Week and jump right to Easter. If we want Easter to mean all that it should for us, we need to celebrate the other events of Holy Week, and not jump from Passion Sunday right to Easter.

I hope you will try to join us for our Holy Week liturgies. The Easter Triduum begins with the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7:30 PM. The Mass includes the washing of feet. Mass will be followed by adoration in church until 11:00 PM. As Jesus invited His Apostles to stay awake and pray with Him the night before He died, we have the opportunity to stay awake also and spend some time in prayer with our Lord.

On Good Friday, Stations of the Cross will take place at 3:00 PM. The Good Friday service of the Lord's Passion will take place at 7:30 PM. At one time, our culture helped keep Good Friday a special day. Stores were closed. Businesses were closed. There were no sporting events on Good Friday. Now, Good Friday is no different in many ways from any other day. That makes it even more important that we do something to mark the significance of this day. Please try to join us for one of our Good Friday services.

On Holy Saturday, Easter baskets will be blessed at 11:00 AM. The Easter Vigil will take place at 7:30 PM. If you have never attended the Easter Vigil, or if it's been a while since you last did, I hope you will consider joining us this year. The Easter Vigil does take considerably longer than a regular Mass would, but it is also very beautiful and meaningful. The symbols we see in church, such as the paschal candle and the baptismal water, are better understood when we attend the Easter Vigil. This year, our catechumen, Jake Matthys, will be received into the Catholic Church as he receives the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. On Easter Sunday, we will have our regular Sunday morning Mass schedule. There will also be a couple of opportunities to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation this week. Confessions will be heard on Tuesday evening from 7:00-8:00 PM, and on Saturday morning from 10:00-11:00 AM.

I hope you will try to join us for our Holy Week services. Jesus could not jump right from His triumphant entry into Jerusalem to the glory of the resurrection. We shouldn't try to make that jump either. Participating in our Holy Week services will add to our celebration of Easter and make it more meaningful. Please try to join us as much as you are able.





Joanne Kuttner, D.Min., specializes in pastoral theology and spirituality. She is a senior lecturer in theology at Lewis University. She applied for and received a Lily Grant for a program called "Engaging Stories," a seven-day theology summer camp bringing together high school students from across the country. She has been the director of the program since its beginning nine years ago. She has also served in a variety of leadership roles in her parish for over 25 years.



### **OUR DROP OF WATER TO EASE BURNING IMMIGRATION ISSUES IN CHICAGO**

In October 2022, Mercy Sisters Pat Murphy and JoAnn Persch were asked by the Sanctuary Working Group to help an asylum-seeking mother and five children from Sierra Leone. They brought the need to the Chicago Mercy Justice Committee of sisters and associates who agreed to find funds, housing, and all else the family would need. They didn't realize that they were on the road to starting a non-profit, but they were.

Visions of the buses, tents, overflowing police stations and shelters impelled a small group to accept and help other asylum-seeking families, and Catherine's Caring Cause, named for Sisters of Mercy foundress Catherine McAuley, was founded. By the end of 2023, it was Catherine's Caring Cause, Inc NFP. Since its inception, CCC has situated nine families in eight furnished homes on Chicago's southside. Each home has a mentor who helps with everything from enrolling kids in school to helping with medical and legal issues to explaining how washing machines work (Google Translate is a God-send for Venezuelan families) and everything in between. We are currently helping 13 adults and 23 children and are searching for two more homes.

We need YOUR help as we struggle to raise funds to pay rent, utilities, legal and medical fees. We also need mentors and others to help with such things as driving and teaching English.
