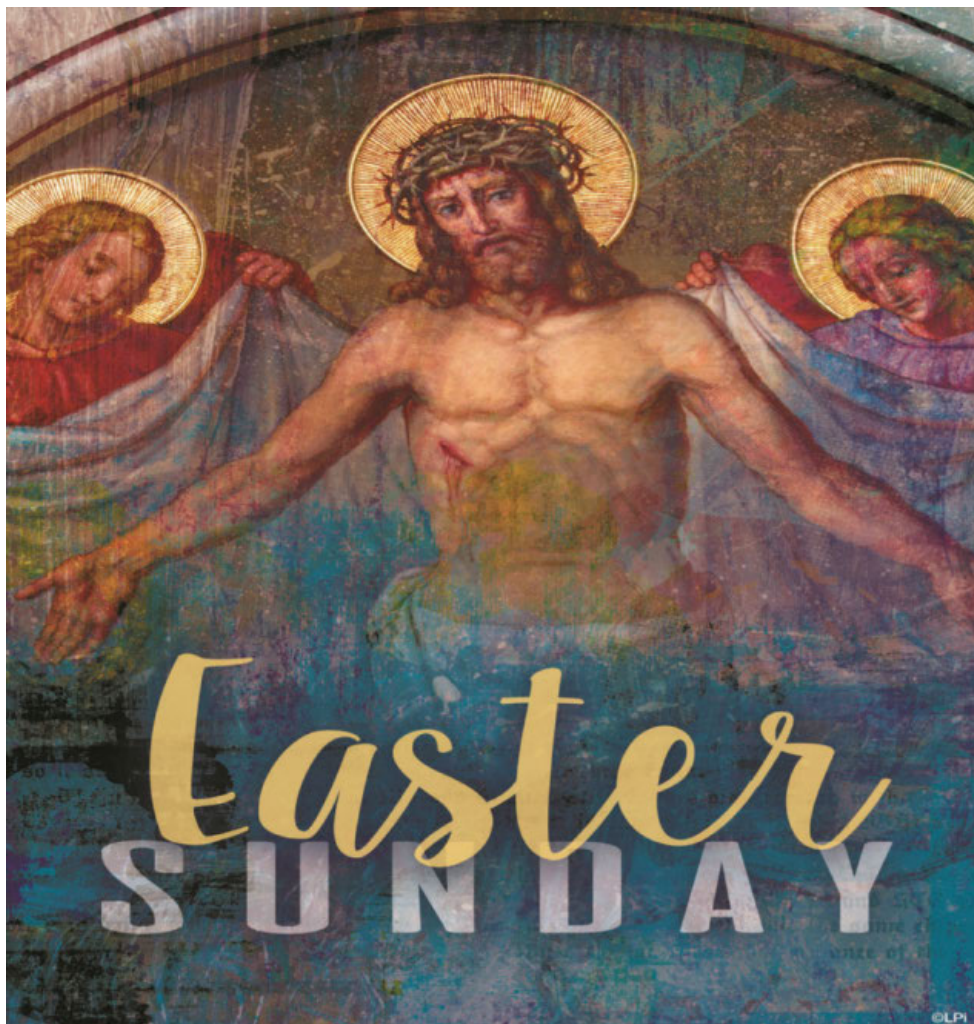

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

On Tuesday, February 13, the day before Ash Wednesday, I put a can of Dr. Pepper in the refrigerator. I was going to give up drinking pop for Lent. (My mother always told me I should give up beer, but I only drink beer once or twice a week. I drink pop almost every day. So, to me, giving up pop is a greater sacrifice and demands greater self-discipline.) The Dr. Pepper has been sitting there for the past 46 days. I plan on drinking it shortly after the Easter Vigil concludes.

I know I am going to go back to drinking pop now that Lent is over. I will also go back to eating cookies, the other thing I gave up. There are some other things though, that I was trying to do for Lent that I want to continue. I want to continue to do them because my life is better when I do them. If Easter is about sharing in new life, then continuing to do these things is something I should do because they make my life new and better.

I'm sure there are things we gave up for Lent that we look forward to going back to now that Lent is over, and Easter is here. But maybe we shouldn't be so quick to go back to everything. If we gave up a bad habit, something that was harmful to us and to others, why would we want to go back to that? Life is new and better for us, and for other people, when that bad habit is gone or under control. That should be something we want to continue.

Maybe we made the effort to get to Mass more often during Lent. Maybe we made sure we got to Mass on Sundays. Maybe we also tried to go to Mass during the week. Our lives may be better because of that. The life of our parish is certainly better because of that. Why go back to our old ways? Why not continue to make sure we get to Mass every Sunday, and maybe try to go once or twice during the week as well?

The same is true of prayer and acts of charity. If we made more time to pray during Lent, why not continue to do so? Why go back to praying less now that Easter is here? If our lives have changed for the better in any way because we prayed more, why not continue to pray more? If we tried to practice greater charity during Lent, we can continue to do so. We make life new and better for others through our acts of charity. Our works of charity also change us into better people. Why not continue to do that?

In one of my favorite gospel passages that we read during the Easter season, the Apostles are at the Sea of Tiberias. Jesus is not with them. Peter announces that he is going fishing. The others say they will join him. When Peter says this, he isn't talking about an afternoon of recreation. Jesus had called him away from his life as a fisherman. Now, Peter is saying he wants to return to his old way of life. Jesus shows up and calls Peter away again from his old life. He tells Peter that from now on, he will feed His lambs and tend His sheep.

Now that Lent is over, we may want to go back to our old ways too. Just as He did with His Apostles though, Jesus calls us not to go back to our old ways, but to continue in a new and better way of life. Jesus wants us to have new life, not just when our life on earth is over, but right now. One way in which we can begin to share that new life might be to not go back to everything we were doing before Lent began. There are some things we may not want to go back to, or that we may want to continue doing, because they make our lives new and better. Continuing to do them will help us begin to share in the new life of the resurrection right now. Happy Easter!

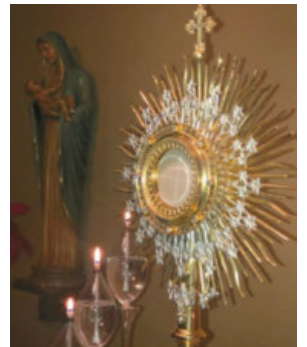

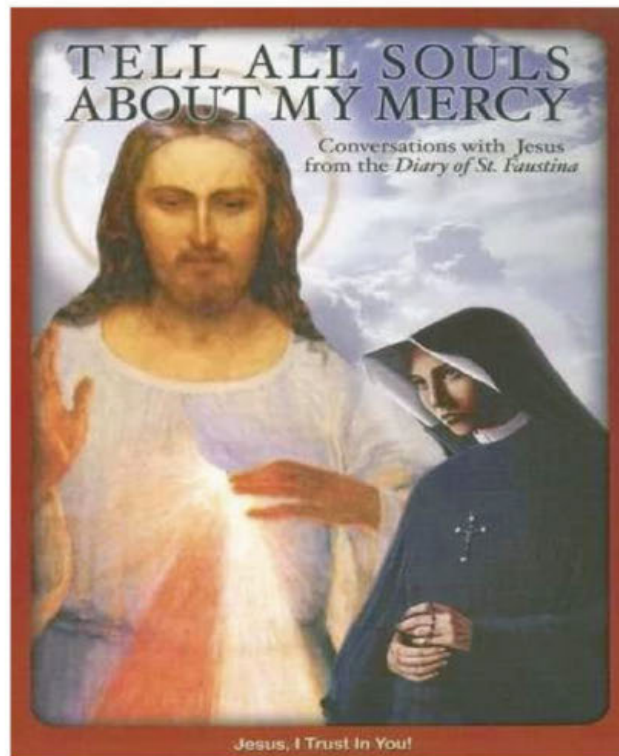

OUR DROP OF WATER TO EASE BURNING IMMIGRATION ISSUES IN CHICAGO

In October 2022, Mercy Sisters Pat Murphy and JoAnn Persch were asked by the Sanctuary Working Group to help an asylum-seeking mother and five children from Sierra Leone. They brought the need to the Chicago Mercy Justice Committee of sisters and associates who agreed to find funds, housing, and all else the family would need. They didn't realize that they were on the road to starting a non-profit, but they were.

Visions of the buses, tents, overflowing police stations and shelters impelled a small group to accept and help other asylum-seeking families, and Catherine's Caring Cause, named for Sisters of Mercy foundress Catherine McAuley, was founded. By the end of 2023, it was Catherine's Caring Cause, Inc NFP. Since its inception, CCC has situated nine families in eight furnished homes on Chicago's southside. Each home has a mentor who helps with everything from enrolling kids in school to helping with medical and legal issues to explaining how washing machines work (Google Translate is a God-send for Venezuelan families) and everything in between. We are currently helping 13 adults and 23 children and are searching for two more homes.

We need YOUR help as we struggle to raise funds to pay rent, utilities, legal and medical fees. We also need mentors and others to help with such things as driving and teaching English.
